

English

• In English, we've been acting and writing playscripts inspired by *Tar Beach*. The children are developing their characters and adding dialogue, showcasing their creativity and teamwork. It's been wonderful to see their confidence grow as they perform in front of their peers. Their writing has been amazing – ask them all about the characters in the story and be transported to New York City in the 1930's!

Guided Reading

• In our guided reading sessions, we have been exploring 'Poems of the Green and Blue Planet' where the children have explored different styles of poem and different themes. The children are enjoying learning more about our wonderful planet and recognising how poets use personification to bring to life natural occurrences, such as hurricanes. Their imagination and creativity is shining through in these sessions. Well done, Lions!

Maths

We have completed Chapter 3 and are now moving on to further multiplication and division. The children
have been mastering the commutative law and exploring different problem-solving strategies. Regular
practice at home on TT Rockstars will help solidify these skills. Please encourage the children to practice
on TT rockstars, as it will support them in current and future learning.

History

• Our history lessons have been a hit as we've been designing our own Roman towns! The children have loved learning about how the Romans transformed Britain and thinking about how to incorporate Roman innovations into their own designs.

Art

• In Art, we've been inspired by Philip Treacy's imaginative hat designs. The children have created their own prints, from designing, painting and transferring to their sketch books. This week, we'll start bringing their designs to life, and I can't wait to see the final results!

Computing

• Our new Computing topic on coding has begun, and the children are already enjoying exploring algorithms and problem-solving. These lessons have been a great way to develop their logical thinking skills.
