

Lion Class Newsletter

I hope you all had a lovely half-term break and got plenty of rest ready for this term! The children have settled back in amazingly, and we've had an exciting and very busy couple of weeks. It's fantastic to see them so engaged and eager to continue their learning. This week, we've also been focusing on Anti-Bullying Week, with some great discussions and activities centred around kindness, respect, and inclusivity. The children have shared thoughtful insights on how we can all help create a supportive environment, both in and outside the classroom. We have started our new story Varjak Paw, and the children are captivated by Varjak's journey so far! They're eager to see what lies ahead for Varjak and where his adventures may take him.

English

• In English, we've been exploring our new text, Tar Beach by Faith Ringgold. The children have written some beautiful bird poems focused on the theme of freedom, connecting to our discussions from Anti-Bullying Week. Next, they'll be working on their own playscripts, and I can't wait to see how they bring their ideas and characters to life!

Maths

• In Maths, we've moved on to multiplication and division, focusing on the 6, 7, 9, and 11 times tables. We're learning about the commutative law (ask your child to explain it-they're doing great!) and other strategies to strengthen their skills. The children are enjoying using songs to help them remember these times tables, as well as completing their weekly times tables grid in class. Please encourage regular practice on TT Rockstars at home to reinforce what we're working on in class.

Reading

In Reading, we are exploring the song, Born This Way by Lady Gaga. The children have led incredible
discussions about the language in the song and it has been amazing to see how the children recognise
that everyone is different and how much they embrace this in the lessons. These lessons have been a
wonderful way to discuss acceptance, linking with our Anti-Bullying Week activities.

Bullying Workshops

• This week, we had a special visit from Altru Drama for an anti-bullying performance and workshop. The children engaged in meaningful discussions about kindness, respect, and inclusion, tying in perfectly with our focus on creating a supportive classroom environment.
