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### Nursery

Nursery mainly focus on eyfs development matters statements age 3-4. Music falls under the "Expressive arts and design" area of learning so targets include e.g. Listen with increased attention to sounds, Respond to what they hear, Sing a pitch of tone, Sing melodic shape of familiar song, Create own songs, Play instruments with feelings. We often use "music express" and "I can" music cds. Music is enhanced through activities such as make own shaker pots, instruments, listening walks, drum outdoors, create a stage, performance area, listening pots, environmental sounds, body sounds, copy musical patterns, musical stories etc. Children sing a lot in nursery! We make up own songs e.g. songs for tidy up, line up time, wash our hands... etc.

There are lots of musical elements in our early Phonics activities through "Letters and Sounds" phase 1 -Communication, Language and Literacy focus but the guidelines refer to how music plays a key part in developing children's learning. There are 7 aspects in Phase 1, all focused on "tuning into sounds", "listening and remembering sounds" and "talking about sounds". Key letters and sound phases for music are Aspect 2 - Instrumental sounds, Aspect 3 - Body percussion, Aspect 4 - Rhythm and Rhyme and Aspect 6 - Voice sounds. We have many songs and musical activities to support this.
