Subject: Art & Design- Colour Theory

LO: I can identify the hue of a colour.



Prior learning: How to create secondary and tertiary colours

Key Facts:

- Hue refers to the origin of the colour we see. Think of the Hue as one of the six Primary and Secondary colours. In other words, the underlying base colour of the mixture you're looking at is either Yellow, Orange, Red, Violet, Blue or Green.
