| English | <p>Children please look at the phonic worksheet and time table for the corresponding sounds , “o”, “ir” whirl and twirl “er” a better letter.</p> <p>Literacy- Can you complete the purple mash 2do ‘paint the picture of a treasure chest.’ Can you write some words such as shiny jewels, gold coins, red rubies etc?</p>  <p>Treasure under the sea</p> <p>Star Challenge - Can you write a sentence about what you have put in your treasure chest?</p> | |
| Maths | <p>Number of the week 13</p> <p>Play ‘Pirates steal the treasure.’ Have 13 pieces of treasure (this could be anything you have around the house.) Get your child to count the 13 pieces. Tell your child to close their eyes and take one item away. Tell your child to open their eyes, then explain how a cheeky pirate has come along and stolen one piece of treasure. How many are left? Get your child to count. Say $13 - 1 = 12$. Repeat with other questions such as $13 - 5 = 8$</p> <p>Star Challenge - Can you write any of these number sentences $13 - 6 = 7$</p> | |
| EYFS Areas of Learning | <p>PE</p> <p>Exercise like a pirate with some of these commands - sweep the deck (pretend to sweep up) Climb the rigging (Pretend to climb up the ladders) Quarter deck (run to the other side of the garden), rats on board (curl up scared in a little ball.
