You will need to follow the following steps:

- 1. Something goes wrong! This could be your character gets lost or falls.
- 2. Introduce the BEAST. Describe how they look, smell, what you hear etc.
- 3. What does your character do?

Talk to an adult about how you may carry on your story.

If your child has written ahead of the introduction, have a look at time adverbials. Time adverbials are words or phrases that tell us when something happened. Here are a few examples.

For a while	In a quick second		
Later	ater After that


