<u>English</u>

• In English, we are coming to the end of The Mermaid of Zennor by Charles Causley. The children have created flipbooks to bring their own aquatic characters to life, and they have started writing their own narratives based on these fantastic creatures. Their creativity has really shone through, and I'm excited to see the finished stories.

<u>Maths</u>

• In maths, we have started working on the addition and subtraction of 4-digit numbers. The children have been using a variety of methods, including number lines and column addition and mental strategies. It's been great to see how supportive they are of each other, especially when tackling more challenging concepts.

Reading

• In Reading, we have begun the book Vikings and have been enjoying learning about the different Viking gods. The children have been fascinated by the myths and stories surrounding gods like Odin, Thor, and Freyja. We've had some great discussions about their powers and roles in Viking culture.

STEM Workshops

• Our STEM workshops have now concluded, and the children absolutely loved them! We explored topics like artificial intelligence, colour, and technology. I've received glowing feedback about how wonderful Shark Class has been. Be sure to check Twitter for photos of our sessions in STEM!
