Wolf Class Newsletter

Update

Firstly, welcome back from hopefully a restful break after a very busy half-term. Before half term, the PTA raised money for school through our Valentines raffle and disco – thank you to everyone for your continued support. All children that attended seemed to enjoy it. Over the past few weeks, Wolf class have continued to demonstrate resilience as they continue to support each other as Year 6 prepare for SATs. This week, our Year 5/6 girls football team attended their final fixtures of the Knowsley Girls' League and to be guaranteed a place in the finals they knew they could not be beaten and needed wins against teams above them – it all came down to their final game, and they needed a win. After gaining an early lead, the girls managed to show determination and teamwork and with a goal line clearance in the final minutes, they managed to hold on to a 1-0 win, securing them a place in the finals. English

Alongside our Guided Reading text, in English we are also reading Templeton Twins by Ellis Weiner and Jeremy Holmes. This week, children have: asked questions to make predictions and made inferences about a character. Next week children will begin to apply their learning by writing a diary entry. Children have already discussed how this narrative is different to other narratives they have read and they are also making connections to other stories such as Cogheart.

Maths

Year 6 have now finished their negative numbers and area and perimeter units, which has challenged their previous knowledge
of area and perimeter. Next children will begin their unit of work on volume. Year 5 have absolutely nailed decimals and have
begun to make connections between fractions, decimals and percentages. Next, they will begin to learn about geometry, focussing
on angles and shapes.

Reading

Wolf Class are currently reading Real-Life Mysteries: Can You Explain the Unexplained? by Susan Martineau and Vicky Barker. This
week, children have: predicted what might happen from details stated and implied; explained how information is related to
meaning; retrieved and recorded key information from non-fiction; summarised the main ideas from multiple paragraphs; and,
made inferences and justified using evidence

Geography

• WOW! Children have shown great knowledge of the USA as we have continued our geography topic. Children have been further developing their knowledge of physical and human features by categorising different USA landmarks – it was fantastic to listen to the children discuss and challenge each other– what do you think, is Mount Rushmore physical or human? Children have also begun to understand how the world is divided in to time zones by imaginary lines called meridians. Next children will begin to investigate the population in rural and urban areas of the USA.
