Wolf Class Newsletter

<u>Update</u>

Since our return, Wolf class have continued to amaze me: their determination and commitment towards their SATs has been outstanding and it is fantastic to see Year 5 supporting their peers in Year 6. Year 6 are continuing to lead by example with their prefect roles and by supporting the introduction of our 'Healthy Swap Station' at lunchtimes. It is fantastic to see so many children choosing to swap their snacks for a healthy option. It is also amazing to see the number of children who have been attending Maths and English after-school clubs. We strongly recommend you advise your child to attend these as we are focusing on test style questions in order to prepare your children for SATs. On top of all this, children from Wolf class have represented Whiston Willis in intra-competitions: Year 5 and Year 6 football and Year 5/6 dodgeball. Finally, this week, children from Year 6 successfully passed their Level 2 Bikeability course, where they demonstrated the skills to safely ride on roads.

<u>English</u>

• The children have been reading Lost Happy Endings, written by Carol Ann Duffy. Children have been developing their understanding of different writing skills such as adverbial phrases of place, time and manner and subjunctive form, before they begin to plan and write their own prequel to the story, imagining how the children may have lived before she turned 'evil' in the story. I know the children are looking forward to writing their stories as much as I am looking forward to reading them.

Maths

Year 6 have now finished their Algebra unit, which they were initially dreading, however through perseverance, they can now confidently solve difficult algebraic equations, using their understanding of inverse operations to solve missing number problems. Next week, they will develop their understanding of area and perimeter. Year 5 have absolutely nailed decimals! They have been able to make connections with fractions to help them read and write decimals, and add and subtract decimals. Next week, they will begin to use their knowledge of fractions and decimals to help them understand percentages.

Reading

• Wolf class have loved our guided reading text 'Cogheart' by Peter Bunzl and have been on the edge of their seats when being read to. Children have continued to ask questions showing their understanding and enthusiasm of the text. Over the past two weeks, children have made inferences, identified connections, retrieved information and summarised chapters and extracts. Children are looking forward to finding out whether their predictions are correct as we expect to finish the story next week.

Geography

- WOW! Children have shown great knowledge of the USA as we have continued our geography topic. Children have been further developing their knowledge of physical and human features by categorising different USA landmarks it was fantastic to listen to the children discuss and challenge each other– what do you think, is Mount Rushmore physical or human? Children have also began to understand how the world is divided in to time zones by imaginary lines called meridians.
- PE
- Over the past two weeks, we have continued our 'Young Olympians' unit, focussing on the correct technique used for shot put. At first, some children struggled with 'the push' but by the end of the lesson all children were able to correctly demonstrate the correct technique.
